# 106th Infantry Division Battlefield Tour

May 13 - 20, 2012

#### INTRODUCTION

In early December 1944, the 31 divisions of Bradley's Twelfth Army Group were already positioned along a 200mile front on Germany's western border. But they were grouped north and south of the Ardennes. Along the 100 miles of the Ardennes front, there were just five US divisions. Why? Well, any sensible German military commander would never have thought that you could successfully attack the Americans across the snow-covered, rocky, forested Ardennes in midwinter. But this was just what Hitler did and he consequently achieved complete surprise. This was where he unleashed his massive, last ditch World War II offensive against the Allies, spearheaded by two elite German armies, Manteuffel's Fifth Panzer Army and Sepp Dietrich's Sixth Panzer Army. That was the start of America's greatest ever land battle, the Battle of the Bulge. One of just five US divisions covering the 100-mile Ardennes front was the newly arrived 106th Infantry Division. With practically no time for preparation and no experience of Ardennes winter combat, 106th Infantry Division was to bear the brunt of Fifth Panzer Army's initial attack towards St Vith.

422nd and 423rd regiments and other units of 106th Infantry Division had a tragically short but nevertheless courageous and vitally important war. Their immediate resistance delayed the German capture of St Vith by a critical two days. The continuing success of Fifth Panzer Army's lightning offensive depended upon quickly using St Vith as a forward supply depot and communications center. But the 106th units became encircled by a German pincer. Attempts to supply


them by air were unsuccessful and they were forced into captivity as prisoners of war on December 19, 1944.

The third regiment, 424th, and other 106th units positioned farther south, evaded encirclement and went on to take part in the heroic defense of St Vith which in its military importance equals Bastogne in the history of the Battle of the Bulge. While St Vith remained in American hands, Sixth Panzer Army was dangerously split from Fifth Panzer Army and lacked southern flank protection.

After the loss of St Vith, 424th and other remaining 106th units withdrew westwards to help defend the northern shoulder of the Bulge. They successfully stopped a German breakthrough northwest to the Meuse between Liege and Namur and onwards to the great port of Antwerp. Their unyielding defense became the anvil against which Patton's Third Army, advancing from Bastogne and the south, could hammer. That soon threatened to smash the supplies and communications lifeline of the Fifth Panzer Army advancing fast towards the Meuse, south of Namur. It was compelled to stop advancing and instead to start quickly retreating back towards Germany before it was cut off.

With that, the Battle of the Bulge, America's greatest ever land battle, was finally over. What happened in the first few chaotic days of the Battle of the Bulge was critical for final victory. Preventing Fifth Panzer Army from gaining quick control of St Vith was of the highest importance, and 106th Infantry Division's contribution to this was indisputable.

Our tour begins with an overview of the opening days of the Battle of the Bulge. We see where Dietrich's Sixth Panzer Army and Manteuffel's Fifth Panzer Army launched their massive offensive. We track in depth the fortunes of the 106th Infantry Division. Please don't hesitate to contact Tim Blixt or MilSpec Tours, and we will do our best to include your special places if at all possible within the tour itinerary. You will also have time and opportunity for private visits. On our last traveling day, we track the route of the 106th Infantry Division POWs from the Bulge to their big POW camp Stalag XIIA. Then we turn south to our final destination Frankfurt at the end of this historic and memorable veterans tour.



#### **Itinerary**

#### **SUN MAY 13 - ARRIVE BRUSSELS AIRPORT**

Everyone arrives independently at Brussels Airport. Then you have free day. Your Final Documents will contain full instructions about how to get to our Brussels Airport hotel (it's quick and easy) and lots of tips about Brussels shopping, sightseeing and eating.

#### **MON MAY 14 - BRUSSELS AIRPORT - AACHEN**

Our Tour Director Patrick Hinchy meets and greets us with

our touring coach at our Brussels Airport hotel. Patrick is multilingual and one of the most experienced veterans tour directors in Europe. From Brussels we head east across Belgium to the Ardennes and Henri-Chapelle American Cemetery for our own ceremonial wreath-laying ceremony. Then we go to Mathilde and Marcel's Belgian farm for a fascinating visit to their own WWII museum and a fun snack lunch. We stay in the historic German cathedral city Aachen. (B, D)



#### **TUE MAY 15 - AACHEN - CLERVAUX**

In an overview of the opening days of the Battle of the Bulge, we see where Dietrich's Sixth Panzer Army and Manteuffel's Fifth Panzer Army launched their massive surprise offensive. We see Monschau, Camp Elsenborn, Rocherath-Krinkelt, Malmedy, Lanzerath, Losheimergraben and more, including the threatening remains of the Siegfried Line, the formidable German border defenses. The beautiful little medieval Battle of the Bulge town of Clervaux is our base for the next several days. (B, D)

#### **WED MAY 16 - CLERVAUX**

We cover the 106th Infantry Division in depth during the first days of the Bulge. It was thinly stretched over 21 miles of the Ardennes front with positions inside Germany. 422nd and 589th FAB were around Auw. 423rd and 590th FAB were around Bleialf. On December 16, 1944, they lay directly in the path of Fifth Panzer Army forces heading to Schoenberg with its vital bridge over the River Our and the road to St Vith beyond. The Germans fought their way to Schoenberg by December 19 in a pincer movement. There was no escape for 422nd and 423rd. They were encircled and captured. But they had critically delayed Fifth Panzer Army's planned December 17 capture St Vith, essential for its speedy advance. 424th and 591st FAB were around Winterspelt to the south and evaded encirclement. They were pulled back to defend St Vith. So were the 81st Com- Note: These are land-only tours. You must book your own trans-Atlantic bat Engineers who held the Pruemerberg Hill until Decem-

ber 21 blocking the main route into St Vith from Germany. In St Vith today there is an impressive 106th Memorial where we shall have a wreath-laying ceremony. (B, D)

#### THU MAY 17 - CLERVAUX

By December 21st the fall of St Vith was inevitable. But Fifth Panzer Army's forward momentum had slowed. We track the 424th's dangerous withdrawal northwards from the St Vith salient through German held territory across the Salm River to the American held northern flank of the

> Bulge. Here from Manhay to Grand-Halleux and Poteau, 106th units tenaciously resisted all German attempts to advance north-west to the Meuse. It's epitomised by 589th FAB's heroic four day resistance against overwhelming forces at Parker's Crossroads, that gave 82nd Airborne time to organize a solid permanent defense. We have a solemn wreath-laying ceremony followed by a festive lunch with our CRIBA friends at Parker's Crossroads. Then via Houffalize and Foy, we visit

Bastogne with the main American Bulge monument and the commemorative Peace Woods. (B, D)

#### FRI MAY 18 - CLERVAUX

Today is a relaxed day. It's your chance if you wish to do your own thing, like explore your own special places, meet old friends, etc. But for the rest of the group, we shall visit Luxembourg City, the outstanding Battle of the Bulge museum in Diekirch and see something of the southern Bulge battlefields. This evening we have a grand Farewell Dinner. (B, D)

#### SAT MAY 19 - CLERVAUX - FRANKFURT

We go east out of the Bulge into Germany. In their memory, we will try and track the historical route of the 106th POWs via Pruem and Gerolstein to the site of Stalag XIIA, their big POW camp outside Limburg. Finally we head to Frankfurt and our airport hotel at the end of this unique, historic and memorable 106th Infantry Division tour. (B)

We do not recommend triple rooms as they tend to be very crowded; in most cases, triple rooms are a twin room to which a cot has been added. There is no reduction in tour cost for triple rooms.

**Deposits and Final Payments:** A deposit of \$400 per person is required to effect reservations. This deposit forms part of your final payment which is due when billed but not later than 90 days prior to departure. Acceptance on tour is subject to verification of payment in full to MilSpec Tours.

**Baggage:** No responsibility is incurred by MilSpec for loss or damage to baggage or any of the passengers belongings. It is recommended that all passengers purchase baggage insurance.

**Passports and Visas:** A valid passport is required for all tour participants. Visas are not required for this tour program.

**Smoking**: Please kindly note that for the safety and well-being of the group, smoking is not permitted on the motorcoach at any time.

Cancellations for unforeseen and valid reasons in advance of departure are entitled to a full refund less actual expenses incurred and a \$75.00 per person service charge, if written notice is received not later than 120 days prior to departure. If cancellation occurs less than 120 days prior to departure, deposits will be refunded less a \$150 per person cancellation charge; less than 60 days prior to departure date, deposits will be refunded, less a \$250 per person cancellation charge plus any penalties assessed to MilSpec Tours by hotels, transportation companies, airlines and other purveyors of services. Cancellations of 30 days or less receive no refund. Trip cancellation and interruption insurance is available and strongly recommended on all tours.

Revisions and Refunds: All changes must be confirmed in writing. A handling fee of \$75.00 per transaction will be charged for any alteration or revision made to a tour reservation.
